Sightseeing



Ludlow Castle

227 locals recommend

A magnificent medieval castle right in the heart of town. Worth a couple of hours, and a great one with kids.



Whitcliffe Common Nature Reserve

A short walk up gives you the classic view back over the town, castle and river. Lovely at golden hour.



Mortimer Forest

34 locals recommend

Miles of walking and mountain-bike trails in the woods just outside Ludlow. Good for a half-day out.



Titterstone Clew Hill

The hill you can see from the house. A wonderful drive and walk on a clear day, with some of the biggest views in Shropshire.



Shelsley Walsh Speed Hill Climb
